- Trainings for relevant institutions and ministries
- Joint development of guidelines and indicators for inclusive education by civil society organisations and the government
- Public events to present the established guidelines to stakeholders in education
- Information material on inclusive education
- A joint media campaign to raise awareness on inclusive education
